Dear Mr. Sorotzkin –

First, let me thank you for your interest in joining Susan G. Komen in our joint fight to end breast cancer. As the global leader of the breast cancer movement, Susan G. Komen for the Cure® has invested more than \$1.9 billion since our inception in 1982 to breast cancer research, education, advocacy, health services and social support programs in the U.S., and through partnerships in more than 50 countries. Without the screenings Hala provides, the more than 125,000 women since 1997 would not have been treated. Thank you for all you have done and continue to do in our unified goal...to end breast cancer. The Israel Race for the Cure provides the opportunity for women and men in Israel to stand together in support stopping this disease.
